Weeping Willow

Salix babylonica

With its elegant, graceful shape the Weeping Willow is easily recognisable because of its distinctive drooping branches.

Description: Average height and spread up to 15m by 12m.

Foliage: Deciduous

Leaves: Dark green, heart-shaped and coarsely toothed, growing between 6 – 10cm in length. They are lopsided and lobed at the base.

Native to UK: No
